NEW YORK, NEW YORK, April 5, 2016 – As the global leader in conflict management, the AAmclarkA®/ICDR® is in a singular position to impact the field of alternative dispute resolution (ADR). The AAA/ICDR believes in getting companies back to business as soon as possible after a dispute, with affordable resolutions at time spans not achievable through other means. To that end, the organization has released key statistics from 2015 cases to educate both users and non-users of ADR.

India Johnson, AAA/ICDR President and CEO asserts, "One of the things we are proudest of is that in 2015, 56% of AAA B2B cases were resolved prior to going to award; 44% of those cases were resolved early enough that they incurred no arbitrator compensation."

She went on to say that "in 2015, we revised the *Construction Arbitration Rules and Mediation Procedures* and, as previously done in the *Commercial Rules and Mediation Procedures* with documented success, added a mediation step to help parties resolve their disputes themselves with the assistance of a mediator."

In addition to statistics—such as the quickest time from filing to award for a 2015 case with a claim over \$1 million was just 35 days, the paper reports on accomplishments in
